Digital ministry is the most **powerful amplifier of the gospel** the Church has ever known.



Without wisdom, digital ministry risks becoming our **biggest** distraction - and a costly detour from true mission.

Five Key Questions for Success in Digital Ministry

What is Our Why?

First Principles is building from truth and stripping away everything that's assumed to start with what's eternal.

Innovation always looks obvious in hindsight. Mission over method.



To help people know Jesus, be discipled in physical community, and live as **change-makers** in the world.

Break the Sunday Only Mold

We challenge our people not to be **Sunday-only Christians**, yet we often model a **Sunday-only church**.



Empower Our People

Work though our people not just on our people. **GPO** (God's People Optimization) **must precede SEO**.



Engage Two Audiences

Church Family and Seekers



Fuse Analog and Digital

The future is not digital or analog, but a fusion of the two.



Measure What Matters

Elevate **spiritual growth** and **life change** above views, likes, or follows.



Stay Rooted in Mission

Digital tools should not change your **mission**. Digital reach is a tool—**physical community is the goal**.

Church Family

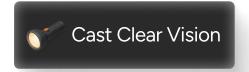
- 1. Provide customized growth paths and resources for each individual.

Seekers

- 1. Provide felt needs content to help individuals solve challenges in their lives.
- 2. Deliver spiritual content that points individuals closer to God.
- 3. Build digital connections that encourage individuals to move to physical community.

- 2. Hold digital teams accountable to the mission.
- 3. Embrace the discomfort that comes with innovation.

- 1. Steward leadership's trust faithfully.
- 2. Prioritize mission over methods.
- 3. Integrate volunteerism into digital ministry.
